

2009 COMMUNITY VISION AWARD submission guidelines



PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The County of San Diego and the San Diego Architectural Foundation (SDAF) have partnered in the Community Vision Award program, which includes both recognition of outstanding urban infill projects and a \$25,000 beautification grant program. The Community Vision Award is designed to recognize and promote the implementation of collaborative, Smart Growth-oriented, sustainable and green building practices in progressively urbanizing areas throughout San Diego. The intent of the program is to encourage the construction of projects that will serve as examples for future urbanization in the San Diego region.

"Smart growth policies and practices are economically sound, environmentally responsible, and supportive of community livability—growth that enhances quality of life. Smart growth is not "no growth," but rather a series of strategies for harnessing the economic energy of growth or redevelopment to improve community livability." www.uli.org

PROGRAM DETAILS:

Award selection is based on an existing (built) architectural structure in the community. The selected project exemplifies design excellence, support of and interaction with its community, implementation of Smart Growth Principles, and sustainable and/or green building features. Projects with residential components are highly encouraged, and given first consideration.

In addition to the recognition and publicity of the award, the Community Vision Award program also awards an annual \$25,000 grant. The funds are to be used exclusively for a material beautification project in the community in which the winning structure is located. A 'Statement of Purpose' is required as part of application process; however, the award selection is based solely on the nominated built structure as it typifies the criteria.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Cooperative association with Developer/Architect and Neighborhood
- Project must be built, and must be located within San Diego County
- Project must have been completed within the recent past (generally within the last three to five years, however, this is not an absolute requirement).
- The winning project will contain a residential component.
- Single family dwellings are not eligible.
- Projects within the Centre City Development Corporation jurisdiction and Downtown San Diego PDO are not eligible for this award (note: This criteria applies simply because of the amount of design and financial support that has gone into the CCDC area and for the reason that the award is intended to encourage quality infill in other communities which have not already benefited from the efforts that have gone into the rebirth of downtown San Diego).

PROGRAM TIMELINE:

Applications with photographs must be postmarked or emailed by Friday, April 10, 2009 in order to be considered for the 2009 Community Vision Award. The winning community and project will be announced in May.
